

Code of Conduct for Players

The club does not have a win at all costs approach and follows an ethos of 'Football for All'. Our all-inclusive policy does not mean sacrificing competition or a winning mentality, but **Fair Play** and **Respect for all others** in the game is fundamentally important.

This Code applies to all players at Killinghall Nomads Junior Football Club.

When playing football you should:

- 1. Always play to the best of your ability and for the benefit of your team
- 2. Play fairly You won't cheat, dive, complain or waste time
- 3. Respect your team-mates, the other team, the referee and your coaches
- 4. Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- 5. Be gracious in victory and defeat You will shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- 6. Listen and respond to what your coaches tell you
- 7. Understand that a coach has to do what is best for the team and not one individual player
- 8. Talk to someone you trust or the club welfare officer if you are unhappy about anything at the club

Violence, foul/inappropriate language and not following the code of conduct may result in any/all of the following actions being taken by your coach:

- Be required to apologise to your team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager
- Make your parent or carer aware
- Receive a verbal warning
- Receive a 'time-out'/be temporarily removed from a session for an appropriate time
- Excluded from a session/match

Repeated or major breaches of the code of conduct may result in:

- You being suspended for a week from all club football activity
- Escalation to the club committee where a small panel (made up from members) will meet with the parent and child and assess appropriate action on a case-by-case basis.
